- According to The Health and Safety Executive (HSE), over one-third of all road traffic accidents (equating to over 500 deaths a year) involve someone who is working at the time.

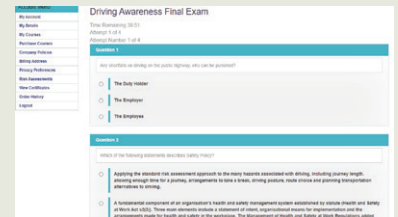
